YAUSBC Association Hosts Successful PSBA Championships

Bowler, their families and friends from all over Pennsylvania and nearby states traveled to the York-Adams area for the 71st Annual Pennsylvania State Bowling Association Championships.

This year's tournament, hosted by the York-Adams USBC Association, began Saturday, March 27th with Opening Ceremonies held at the Hanover Bowling Centre. After 12 weekends of competition, no bowling was conducted during the Easter weekend, the event concluded on Sunday, June 20th.

The five bowler team event was held at Lincolnway Lanes while the singles and doubles events were held at the Hanover Bowling Centre. Along with the chance to be crowned handicap and scratch division state champions bowlers in each event were competing for a portion of the \$232,000.00 total prize fund. Brackets, high game jackpots, and chances on a bowling ball from Visionary Bowling Products, a major sponsor of the tournament, were also offered to the bowlers.

The tournament ended with a total of 1,486 team, 3,518 doubles, 7,036 singles, and 6,604 paid all events. The York-Adams USBC Association led the way in the team event with a total of 871 teams.

Plans for the event actually started three years ago when the association placed a bid to hold the championships at the annual PSBA convention. The association won the bid and many hours of planning began by board members of the PSBA and YAUSBC and volunteers

to provide a quality championship tournament to the bowlers of Pennsylvania. Months prior to the tournament a number of committees were formed. Those committees decided on such things as opening ceremony activities, logos and souvenirs for the event, small games of chance, and more. The association members also solicited sponsors for advertising and a 94 page tournament program book was published.

Members of the YAUSBC Association competed in every events and divisions of the 71st Annual PSBA Championship Tournament hosted by the YAUSBC.

The association led the state in team event entries with 871 teams. Many of those team bowlers also competed in the singles, doubles, and the all events category.

YAUSBC Association members were able to cash in many of the events winning a total of \$15,190.00.

The team of Detaille Express was the highest placing team in the handicap team division with a 38th place finish.

The top twenty-five finishers in the singles handicap event were Nolan Barshinger with a 3rd place finish. In seventh place was Timothy Hymiller.

Brian Doll had a 22nd place finish in the singles scratch division.

Three Inducted to the York-Adams USBC Hall-Of-Fame

Stephen Carbaugh, Barbara Sollenberger, and Barry Sparks were inducted into the York-Adams USBC Hall-of-Fame at the Annual Dinner Dance held Saturday, February 20th.

Stephen Carbaugh has been inducted into the YAUSBC Hall-of-Fame for his bowling achievements. Steve currently resides in Hanover with his wife Charolette and son Cameron.

Steve started bowling at the age of 9. He joined the Saturday Morning Preps at Go-Go Bowling Center in Hanover, then later moved to the Hanover Bowling Centre.

In adult leagues, Steve has averaged over 200 in every season, with 234 being his career high in the 2004-2005 season. Steve recorded his first 300 game in 1996. Since that time, Steve has registered 21 - 300 games and 10 - 800 series with 825 as his personal best. This also includes a PBA 300 game which he bowled in a PBA regional tournament in Johnstown in 1997. Steve is also a 2 time York County Match-Game Champion, having captured the tournament in 2003 and 2005.

Steve has participated in 20 USBC National Tournaments. He registered an All-Events total of 2006 in the 1991 tournament in Toledo, Ohio. He and his Bair's Den teammates finished 31st in the team event in Syracuse in 1999. Locally Steve has also done well in the County Tournaments, with the Scratch All-Events title in a team title with his Bair's Den teammates. In 1993 Steve also won the John Wilcox Scratch Singles Tournament in Williamsport. Steve has captured the High Average Award several times in the Tuesday Industrial League at Hanover Bowling Centre and twice in the Friday Night Travel League.

Barbara Sollenberger has been inducted into the YAUSBC Hall-of-Fame for her bowling ability.

Since turning the ripe age of fifty she has carried a book average of 200 up until last year when she finished with a 199.

Barbara started bowling around 1980 at East Lincoln Lanes in a Friday Night Mixed League. She

then went to a Thursday late league and added a Tuesday afternoon league and a Thursday night

ladies league. That was enough!!!! Barbara, at the time, was a mother of five children, ages 5 to 11. They all bowled in the Saturday Youth League with Herb and Ruth Leaman at East Lincoln Lanes. Sooooo, needless to say, she spent lots of time at the bowling lanes.

Barbara's children are Tracy Bair, Michelle, Russell, Kevin, Eric, and Michael Sollenberger, who is deceased.

Barbara bowled her first 600 series when she was bowling as a sub. She was very excited about it and thought that this is as good as it gets. It 1986 and 1989 along with team members Liz Leaman, Mary Shoop, Judy Whorley, and Donna Fitzkee she won the York County Women's Scratch team event. In 1987 she won the York County Women's Doubles Event with Marian Hunter. She then went on to win the 1st Pennsylvania State 600 mail-in Tournament.

In 2006 she won the Pennsylvania State Mixed Doubles with Barry Gilbert and placed 3rd in the National 600 Doubles tournament with Donna Fitzkee.

Barbara has bowled two 299 games, one with an Eleven-In-A-Row honor score. Her best of all is a 300. Her bowling skills also include many 700 series. Barbara has bowled in five national Tournaments. She has also bowled in many State Tournaments.

She loves seeing her children and grandchildren enjoying and doing so well in the sport of bowling. She hopes that she may have had a little to do with their success.

Barbara now has problems with her hand and has not been bowling except for subbing in leagues. Her hope is to recuperate and return in the near future. As for now, with her life partner Bud, enjoy their place at the shore and spend their winter months in Florida.

Barry Sparks has been covering bowling in York County for 22 years. He began by writing a weekly bowling column in the *York Daily Record* in 1987. In 1989, the York County Bowling Proprietors Association hired Barry to handle their bowling publicity. During the past 20 plus years, he has written hundreds of feature articles for the *York Daily Record*, *York Dispatch*, *York Sunday News*, and the *Hanover Evening Sun*.

As part of that coverage, he implemented the Top 10 bowling stories of the year, top 25 averages for men and women, Bowler of the Decade for both men and women, and Bowler of the week.

Barry annually covers the York-Adams USBC Hall-of-Fame banquet, PBA East Regional Open Tournament, the PBA East regional Seniors Tournament, and the York County Match-Play Championship for which he has served as tournament director since its inception in 1996.

Barry has discussed "How to Generate Local Bowling Publicity" at the BPAA National Convention in San Francisco in 1995 and at the 2000 and 2005 East Coast Bowling Proprietors Expo in Atlantic City.

As a freelance writer, he has been a regular contributor to *Bowling Center Management* since 1995. He has also contributed to *Bowlers Journal*, *Pro Shop Operator*, and the *International Bowling Industry*. His award-winning article, which appeared in *Bowling Center Management*, focused on the efforts to rebuild ABC East Lanes in Harrisburg after a devastating fire.

Barry had been married to his wife Ann for 38 years. They have two sons, Steve and Brandon, three grandchildren, Colton, Michael, and Ella.

He is a senior communications specialist for WellSpan Health, where he has worked in the Public Relations and Communications Department since 1982.
